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## HISTORY

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The CiTi BOCES Migrant Education Tutorial and Support Services Program (METS) began in 1983 to assist school districts in meeting the unique needs of migrant children. The program provides each child and family with individualized services. As one of eight METS centers in New York State, we serve migrant youth in 36 school districts spanning four counties.

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## ELIGIBILITY

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Students (0-21) may be eligible if they have moved across school district or state boundaries within the last three years in order that they, a parent or guardian might secure or search for employment in agriculture.

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## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

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*Migrant educators assess student needs and provide support or facilitate referrals in the areas of:*

- Academic Support Services
- Health Services
- Family Literacy
- Advocacy and Outreach
- Referral Assistance

*For preschool students, additional services may include:*

- Referrals to preschool programs, where available
- In-home instruction to assist preschoolers in the areas of language development, reading, motor skills, and Kindergarten readiness

*For in-school students, additional services may include:*

- In-school or In-home tutoring
- Educational field trips
- Free lunch eligibility

*For out-of-school youth, additional services may include:*

- In-home instruction to improve English language skills.
- High school equivalency instruction
